

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- New Exhibit Entry Times: The Exhibition Hall will be open for the purpose of accepting exhibits, including perishables on Friday August 4th from 4:00pm to 8:00pm, Saturday August 5th from 8:00am to 4:00pm and Sunday August 6th from 9:00 to Noon. No articles will be accepted after Noon on Sunday. Suggestion: due to the plants and flowers expiring quickly in the heat bring them in on Sunday.
- All articles in the Exhibition Hall will remain in place until the following Monday, August 14th. The Exhibition Hall Superintendent will dispose of expired perishables through the week to try and control the insect problem.
- Exhibition Hall will be open on Monday after the fair from 4:00pm to 8:00pm for the purpose of removing exhibits. Any exhibits not picked up will be held in the Exhibition Hall office and arrangement will need to be made by the exhibitor for future pick up.
- Grange and Garden exhibits are to be finished on Saturday August 5th by 4PM. Special exceptions can be made if previously approved by the Hall Superintendent in advance.
- In any class where quantity is specified the exhibit will be disqualified if the quantity requirement is not met.
- Competition is open to all residents living within the State of Maine.
- The Society will afford the best possible care to all exhibits. However, it distinctly disclaims any liability for loss or damage to displays or personal property of the exhibitors. All Perishables will be disposed of at the end of the fair unless previously specified.
- 8. Quality will be considered in judging, and it is possible that awards may not be made in a specific class even though there are entries in that class. Awards will be made at the discretion of the judges.
- Positively no premium will be paid on any article previously exhibited. All exhibits must have been made within the last year. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 10. All articles must be made by the person under whose name they are exhibited, apart from quilts entered in Class #7 Lot #38 (Pieced by Entrant-Machine Quilted Professionally, Not by Entrant)" Borrowing or purchasing any exhibited article will bar the entire exhibit and forfeit all premiums.
- 11. Due to lack of space, the Superintendent of Halls reserves the right to limit entries in any class. No more than TWO items per category, per class, per lot. This will eliminate competing against yourself.
- 12. An Exhibitor's ONE DAY (admission only, rides not included) pass will be given to all exhibitors, who register 3 or more items for competition. Passes will be given out at the time of registering only. One pass per exhibitor per fair will be given.

- **13.** Exhibition Hall will be open during the fair from 9am to 9pm.
- 14. Exhibition Hall- Age Categories are:
 - 5X under 17
 - Adult 17 61
 - · Senior 62 & over.
- 15. If you send your entry form in by way of the web, you will receive a reply. If you do not receive a reply, please bring a hard copy with you.
- 16. Entries with names on them will be disqualified.

NOTES:

- You may register early to SAVE WAITING in line. Please fill In the Exhibition Hall Entry Form. Entries will also be accepted during registration hours.
- Due to our early fair date the produce will be accepted at any age of maturity
- Any class which specifies "Plate" will be exhibited on a plate provided by the society BEST OF SHOW AWARDS

There will be an additional CASH PRIZE of \$25.00 for each outstanding exhibit in the Topsham Fair Exhibition Hall. All exhibits are eligible, but Best of Show awards may not be given in all classes.

Selecting and Preparing Produce for Exhibit Judging Standards:

Excellent: Clean, free from any damage, uniform in size, true to variety.

Good: Free from damage (no more than 5% loss of total weight), relatively uniform in size, fairly true to variety.

Worthy: Fairly clean, free from serious damage (no more than 10% loss of total weight), fairly uniform in size

No Award: Dirty, seriously damaged, overmature, extremely different in size, shape, or color.

Trim Correctly: Cut off tops of all root crops about 1 inch above the roots.

Quantity: Check Fair Premium Book for proper quantity. **Wash or Brush:** Harvest only clean vegetables or wash with soft brush or soft cloth.

Type: Specimens must represent type of variety.

Size: Specimens should be uniform in size. Oversize means coarseness, while undersize means often lack typical color. Roots: Stems and roots should be either "all off" or "all on". Hint: Provide detail regarding your exhibit. Retain your seed packets for this information. When exhibiting several specimens, try to have them uniform in size and level of ripening.

Remember, the largest may not be the Ideal.

Please note: we are all volunteers and are happy to donate our time to making the Exhibition Hall the best it can be. Your patience is greatly appreciated.

Judging Guidelines:

All pies must contain only the fruit of the contest (i.e., apple, blueberry). Pies made from a combination of fruits will be disqualified from judging (such pies will be disqualified at the state level.) The recipes must be cooked as submitted. Judges will eliminate from consideration any pie which obviously is not done as the written recipe states (example: a pie which contains raisins, but no raisins are listed in the written recipe.)

Judging will be done in three basic categories:

- Appearance: Judges are looking for overall eye appeal, uniformity of shape, color, and appearance of the crust.
- 2. Taste: The crust and filling are to be judged separately. In evaluating the crust judges will consider flavor, texture, and color.

 Preparation: This is to be determined from the written recipe which will accompany each entry from the beginning to completion. Judges will consider ease of preparing the recipe and how clearly the recipe ingredients and instructions are written.

Scoring Guidelines:

Judges must use the score sheet as supplied. The categories are as follows:

- Overall appearance: 30 Points
- Crust (Flavor, Texture, Color): 30 Points
- Filling (Flavor and consistency): 30 Points
- Ease of preparation and clarity of recipe: 10 points

Judges shall total the points for each entry. The contest coordinator will compile the judges scores on a summary sheet. The positions will be determined by the total number of points given by all the judges. In the event two or more contestants have identical point totals, the judges shall determine the order of finish by mutual agreement. All decisions shall be final. Ingredients:

Doughnuts

- 1 ½ cups (300g) King Arthur Unbleached All Purpose Flour
- ¼ tsp baking soda
- ½ tsp salt
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp nutmeg
- ¼ cup (50g) vegetable shortening
- 2 large eggs
- ¾ cup (170g) mashed potatoes
- ½ cup milk
- 1 ½ quarts lard, vegetable shortening or vegetable oil, for frying

Coating

Granulated sugar or cinnamon sugar

King Arthur Mashed Potato Donut Recipe:

Instructions:

- 1. Sift together the flour, baking soda, salt, baking powder and nutmeg. Set aside.
- 2. In a separate bowl, cream together the shortening and sugar. Add the eggs and mashed potatoes to the shortening mixture.
- 3. Measure out milk. Add the flour and milk alternately to the creamed mixture, beginning and ending with the flour mixture.
- 4. The resulting dough will be quite soft, more like drop-biscuit dough instead of "rollable" dough. The dough can be covered and refrigerated overnight, if desired.
- 5. Turn the dough out onto a very well floured surface and knead a few times to make it stiff enough to roll with a rolling pin. Roll the dough using a well-floured rolling pin until it's about ½" thick. Dip a dough cutter in flour (each time you cut), and cut the doughnuts. Save the holes; or re-roll them with leftover dough. Try to handle the dough as little as possible; the less you work the dough, the tenderer the doughnuts will be.
- 6. Heat the fat to 365'. Test the temperature with a thermometer; slice of bread: lower half slice of bread into the hot fat; if it takes 1 minute for the bottom side to brown nicely, the fat is at the best temperature for frying doughnuts.
- 7. Fry doughnuts about 2 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Drain on brown paper bag or paper towel. Check one of the fried doughnuts after it's cool to be sure the center is cooked through.
- 8. While still warm, shake doughnuts in cinnamon sugar or plain granulated sugar.
